 - Transit oriented development


Environmental Goals

Corridor (transit oriented development).


Transit architecture

Highway (helter-skelter)




Huge consumer of resources, fuel, land, air, time & money!

Commentary – Key points

- Merge rail plan with transit oriented development.
 - Zone by corridors.
- Integrate plan with economic and environmental plans
- Joint implementation with: Transportation, Economic and Environmental Dept's. at senior level.
- 4. Transition from net consuming state to a net producing state.

- 5. Need to restore manufacturing to increase exports.
 - 300,000 autos sold in Mass /yr =\$6B out of state (100,000 jobs).
 - Preserve ROW's, rail and industrial infrastructure.
 - Manufacturing needs to be part of economic development plan.
- 6. Manage local objections to "growth" (local veto).
