







FFYs 2008-16 TIP Target Program





FFYs 2008-16 TIP Transit Program

- Transit funds are distributed to the state's Regional Transit Authorities (RTAs) by formula
 - MBTA approximately \$286 million annually
 - MWRTA almost \$2 million annually
 - CATA under one million annually





How to Apply This Information

- Provides a baseline to inform future investment strategies
- Helps gauge consistency with MAP-21
- Supports the development of future performance targets
 - Reduce GHG emissions by 10% or 25% by 2020
 - What level of investment is necessary for 10% vs.
 25% reduction?
