Review of August 20, 2024, Meeting



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August 20, 2024, TIP Committee Meeting

- In August, the TIP Committee previewed process changes for the FFYs 2026–30 TIP
- Changes included:
 - Establishing a better process for Transit Transformation project applications
 - Trialing Quarterly Readiness Updates to the MPO board
 - Municipal Pre-Readiness Days

Challenges from FFYs 2025–29 TIP Development



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Challenges from FFYs 2025–29 Development

- The Boston Region MPO is taking steps to mitigate major project programming challenges, and full resolution of these issues will take time
- Many challenges in developing the FFYs 2025–29 TIP will persist in developing the FFYs 2026–30 TIP
- These challenges include:
 - Project cost increases and delays
 - Increasing reliance on Advance Construction funding
 - Slackened project application volumes



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Project Cost Increases and Delays

- At TIP Readiness Days for the FFYs 2025–29 TIP, 16 of 28
 projects were recommended for delay with another 8 flagged as at risk for delay
 - The majority of delays fell within FFYs 2025 and 2026
 - 13 projects had cost increases above 10%
- These cost increases and delays led to:
 - Unprecedented surpluses of funding in FFYs 2025 and 2026, without municipal-proponent projects ready to utilize the sudden funding availability
 - Deficits in FFYs 2027 and 2028, necessitating additional delays that both jeopardized funding for new projects in FFY 2029 and raised the question of removing projects from the TIP



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Advance Construction Funding

- Advance Construction is the mechanism by which projects are funded across their construction period, rather than in a lump sum in their advertising year
- Historically, adopted TIP Scenarios leveraged Advance
 Construction to support larger-scale (>\$25 million) projects
 - Recent readiness trends have led to greater reliance on Advance Construction for smaller projects
 - While not atypical, as many other MPOs in Massachusetts utilize this strategy, there are longer-term implications



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Advance Construction Funding

- In the FFYs 2025–29 TIP, Advance Construction was used to:
 - Support long-term advance construction of McGrath Highway, Rutherford Avenue, and Western Avenue in FFY 2029
 - Shift funding from a deficit year of FFY 2028 into FFY 2029
 - Partial-fund new projects in FFY 2029, with their remainder planned in FFY 2030




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Project Application Volumes

- Applications for TIP funding in Core Investment Programs* have declined markedly since FFYs 2021-25
- Down from 17 applications to 4
- Staff expect this figure to stabilize in FFYs 2026-30, albeit at low application levels for now

*Core Investment Programs refer to projects outside of the Community Connections Investment Program.





- TIP How-To Discussions for applicants will be held November 7 and 12 at 1:00 PM






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Project Readiness Updates

- What are Municipal Readiness Days?




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Scenario Development






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FFYs 2026–30 TIP Draft Period

- After a scenario is selected, a vote on the draft TIP is tentatively planned for April 17
 - 30-day public comment period
- May 22 TIP Committee meeting will preview any changes that may emerge between draft and endorsement
